As T.S. Eliot wrote in his Four Quartets, "In my end is my beginning." As we greet September we begin again.

On Sunday, September 17, our Adult Formation Series returns for its second year. The program will feature religious issues, a glance at the "minor" Prophets, conversations with fascinating people who live in our community, and a couple of other surprises along the way.

What happens when we die? Where did the Christian teachings on heaven and hell come from? Most Americans believe in a literal heaven and hell to find its primary source in the Bible. We will meet on Sundays at 9:30 am in the sanctuary and explore the Greek, Jewish and Christian understanding of the afterlife. I invite you to join me on a guided tour of Heaven and Hell.

Help is needed in all Worship Help areas. Please see Carla to volunteer!

Lay Reader – read the Scripture for the day. Readings can be emailed in advance for you to preview.

<u>Communion Assistant</u> – help with distribution of the Sacrament holding the wine and juice "The blood of Christ shed for you!"

<u>Communion Set-up</u> – cube bread and place in cups/basket, Pour wine into cups using sanitized hands and minimize touch of the communion elements.

<u>Usher</u> – make sure everyone has a bulletin, a chair, or any other assistance. Light the candles prior to the worship and extinguish them after worship.

<u>Offering Counter</u> – count the Sunday offering and prepare it for deposit.

<u>Altar Guild</u> – ensure that altar coverings (paraments), communion cloths and banners are clean and changed seasonally (can be done prior to Sunday) Fill altar candles with oil, as

<u>Power Point Prep</u> – using the weekly bulletin as a guide, copy/paste the Order of Worship into a Power Point presentation (can be done at home in advance and emailed to the soundbooth).

<u>Videographer</u> – each week we live-stream the worship service. A new system is in place that is user friendly and training is available.

Sound booth tech and PowerPoint – sit at the sound booth, advance the power point slides when appropriate, and run the equipment.

Training is available for each position.

If you are unable to serve on the scheduled date, please make every effort to find a replacement and contact the church office no later than Wednesday, prior to the date you are scheduled. 330-653-5980
