Dear Friends:

Hodie (This Day) is a Christmas Cantata by the English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams. Composed between 1953 and 1954, it is Vaughan William's last major choral-orchestral composition, and was premiered under his baton at Worcester Cathedral, as part of the Three Choirs Festival, on 8 September 1954. I first came to know the composition many years ago while a soloist with the New Jersey Oratorio Society. Each year at Christmastime I take an hour to listen again to the story of the birth of Christ and marvel how lovingly Vaughan Williams sets the story to music.

The first "choral", of the sixteen-movement work, is set for unaccompanied chorus, and uses a translation by Miles Coverdale of a hymn by Martin Luther. The poem reminds us of Christ's redeeming work for all of humanity. Enjoy this short but powerful text and give thanks to God for the gift of the Christ child.

The blessed son of God only
In a crib full poor did lie;
With our poor flesh and our poor blood
Was clothed that everlasting good.
Kyrie eleison. (Lord, have mercy)

The Lord Christ Jesu, God's son dear,
Was a guest and a stranger here;
Us for to bring from misery,
That we might live eternally.

Kyrie eleison.

All this did he for us freely,
For to declare his great mercy;
All Christendom be merry therefore,
And give him thanks for evermore.






CHRISTIAN UNITY PRAYER SERVICE AND LUNCHEON SCHEDULED FOR January 18, 2024

In celebration of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, Hudson churches are planning the annual interdenominational prayer service and luncheon scheduled for Thursday, January 18, 2024 at 10:00 AM. First Congregational Church of Hudson, located at 47 Aurora St., will host the event. The ecumenical prayer service, led by local clergy, will focus on the theme, "You shall love the Lord your God...and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27) Rev Lynn Anderson, Chaplain of Independent Living at Laurel Lake, will give the sermon.

The resources for this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by a group of Christians from Burkina Faso, West Africa.

The ticket price is \$20.00 per person for the luncheon and speaker portion of the event. Tickets are available through Carla Maurer or Ginny Pillsbury. Make checks for tickets payable to Rejoice Lutheran Church. Attendees wishing to hostess a table may indicate their preference when contacting their church representative. **Reservation deadline is January 14, 2024.**

The prayer service is free and open to all; it does not require a ticket to attend. This year's offering will be divided with half going to the HCSA Food Pantry and half to Doctors Without Borders.

The week of Prayer for Christian Unity has been celebrated throughout the world since 1908 and it has been celebrated in Hudson since 1968. The Christian Unity Prayer Service brings the churches from our community together through prayer and praise, reflecting the prayer of Jesus Christ, "That all might be one" (John 17:21).





Clear Bags Recycled into Park Benches - St. Stephens Collection





<u>Lay Reader</u> – read the Scripture for the day. Readings can be emailed in advance for you to preview.

<u>Communion Assistant</u> – help with distribution of the Sacrament holding the wine and juice "The blood of Christ shed for you!"

<u>Communion Set-up</u> – cube bread and place in cups/basket, Pour wine into cups using sanitized hands and minimize touch of the communion elements.

<u>Usher</u> – make sure everyone has a bulletin, a chair, or any other assistance. Light the candles prior to the worship and extinguish them after worship.

<u>Offering Counter</u> – count the Sunday offering and prepare it for deposit.

<u>Altar Guild</u> – ensure that altar coverings (paraments), communion cloths and banners are clean and changed seasonally (can be done prior to Sunday) Fill altar candles with oil, as needed.

<u>Power Point Prep</u> – using the weekly bulletin as a guide, copy/paste the Order of Worship into a Power Point presentation (can be done at home in advance and emailed to the soundbooth).

<u>Videographer</u> – each week we live-stream the worship service. A new system is in place that is user friendly and training is available.

<u>Sound booth tech and PowerPoint</u> – sit at the sound booth, advance the power point slides when appropriate, and run the equipment.

Fellowship—ensure that someone is signed up to bring a snack, make coffee and clean-up

Help is needed in all Worship Help areas. Please see Carla to volunteer!
